(p. 117) "Dogs don't gossip. Dogs don't backstab. Dogs don't do mean."

(p. 121) "I look over at Whistler. Whistler looks up at me and it's obvious he's smiling, his droopy eye like a slow wink, like he wants me to know, 'I've got your back.'"

(p. 437) I disliked only one incident in the book. I didn't just dislike the characters but felt that this interaction between the child psychiatrist and parents went against the grain of the entire novel. After it was recommended that the parents get another dog, the father responded, "'No, no way, says Mark, straightening up, 'we're not dog people. Never were. Okay, Toasty makes sense, but one's enough. Another dog is the last thing we need.'"

What this gives us is a beautiful story about the bond between a boy and his dog, and the difference that the right pet can bring to someone's life. Whistler doesn't just change Jasper's life, he opens Kate's eyes to things she had previously refused to see. It's an educational experience for those of us reading the book too, as to whether we can embrace a dogs' philosophy on life to just be in the moment, rather than constantly thinking ahead or behind.

Each chapter alternates between Kate and Jasper's perspective, and whilst I usually hate this narrative technique on this occasion it was spot on. Kate and Jasper had very unique voices, and I loved the innocence and naivety of being in Jasper's head, in particular his Tupac-a-day habit, and his interpretation of a DUI. It was beautiful, because to a large extent it did feel like being in an 11 year olds head, rather than that of an adult.

I'm not ashamed to admit this book had me in tears at multiple times. It's just an all round beautiful, heart warming book about a boy and his dog. About not being afraid to live life. Of about looking beyond appearances and seeing the heart underneath. It's an absolute must read.
