She quickly discovers that despite being hard work, this is something that makes her feel competent and appreciated, as well as a part of this friendly little community. She also discovers that the sulky and uptight organiser Simon Graham is very different, once he dons a pirate costume. His character Captain Ian Blackthorne rather likes the tavern wench Emma (Emily's character) to the point of agreeing to undergo a beautifully romantic ceremony of binding, a kind of temporary betrothal for a year and a day after which the couple may decide to part and go their separate ways or...declare a different kind of intentions.
